How to Compute your FN and Sciences/Math GPA:

Each letter grade is equal to a certain amount of quality points. For example, an A=4 points. Therefore a 4-credit course with a grade of "A" would be worth 16 Quality Points (QP). You must complete this calculation for all courses listed above. If you repeated a class, you **must** indicate the original grade earned and the repeated course grade.

Final step: Divide the total number of **Quality Points** by the total number of **Credits** earned (omit credit for FN 100). Example: If you earned 78 QP and the total number of credits earned is 24 then your GPA would be 3.25 $(78 \div 24 = 3.25)$.

A complete listing of the grading system: GRADE QUALITY POINTS:

A 4.00, A- 3.67, B+ 3.33, B 3.00, B- 2.67, C+ 2.33, C 2.00, C- 1.67, D 1.00, and F 0.00.

Submit to FN Undergraduate Program Director by November 15 for Fall acceptance and April 15 for Spring acceptance.

Application to the FN major: Documentation of Nutrition and Dietetics – Related Experiences

Provide documentation to the best of your ability. While further documentation proof is not required with your application, you may be asked to verify should there any questions regarding your information provided.

INSTRUCTIONS: Consider all paid and volunteer experiences completed upon enrollment in undergraduate studies that relate to the DPD concentration. For example, clinical, food service and management, community, public health, wellness, research, civic engagement, customerservice, etc.

- While 50-hours is required for application, you should include more. You are also encouraged to focus your experience gaining clinical exposure; this may include a hospital, LTC or nursing home diet office paid or as a volunteer.
- Be sure your name is the form.

PLEASE NOTE: THIS RECORD IS STRICTLY FOR APPLICATION TO THE DPD MAJOR.

- If you plan to apply to a DI, please consider gaining clinical exposure to patient care at some point during the program. Clinical practice is what most DI Directors are looking for in an applicant.
- Applicants entering the major in 2018 and afterwards please note, you will be required to have a graduate degree as eligibility for the RDN.
